CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Dear Members,

This is my first report in two years where we are no longer dealing with COVID restrictions, and we are back to “normal” – whatever that means these days. We are now learning to live with COVID so please stay aware, practice good hygiene, and stay safe. More importantly, if you are feeling unwell, please stay home because we are dealing with both COVID and influenza this winter.

The lifting of the COVID restriction has seen our functions business start to return to normal with many of our corporate clients resuming their seminars and the training sessions. We are again receiving many enquiries for social functions, weddings, birthdays, and wakes – the circle of life so to speak – and they all need to be celebrated.

Membership renewals are due in June and again there will be no increase in the annual subscriptions for the coming year despite the Affiliation fees increasing by \$14.00 (BQ – \$12 and GDBA – \$2). Bowls Club memberships continue to decline and rather than assist Clubs to find a way to increase their memberships, BQ simply increase their fees every year to maintain their financial position. A document was distributed recently that demonstrated this over the past twenty years. That being said – We will obviously need to have a discussion about Annual Subscriptions at the AGM in September.

Since we introduced the Club Rewards system for the members it has proved to be very popular. However, we have had a number of members recently who have accumulated significant numbers of points and they have very generously donated them back to the

Club. This is something we never expected and so we have now set up a facility in the POS system where members can now easily donate their Rewards points back to the Club. Should you wish to do that, please just ask our friendly staff.

Last year, during November and December, the members agreed to play on Saturday morning so the Club could take advantage of the barefoot bowls bookings on offer for Christmas parties. Not only did the members enjoy the change of having Saturday afternoon to spend with family or attend their own Christmas parties, but the Club did extremely well, generating significant revenue from BFB parties. This year will be even busier and so we will be asking members to start Saturday morning bowls earlier in October because we are already receiving enquiries and we need this revenue to continue to develop our Club and improve the amenities.

Our Bowls Director, Ian Svensson, is looking for more volunteers, especially for the pre-Christmas period so please register your name if you can help because we will need quite a few if we are to spread the workload and not leave it all on Ian's shoulders. This will be a time when we can all contribute.

There will be a number of the volunteer bar crew who will be contributing many hours behind the Bar to assist because it is very hard to recruit staff at the moment and our contribution saves many hours in labour costs so we can all do something to contribute to raising revenue during this very busy time.

Congratulations to Shayne Parry and Neil Smith on the success of their first “Come

and Try Day” where six new members joined the Club. It was an extremely well-run day with a number of our “younger” members participating to conduct games with the thirteen people who came along so they could get the feel of actually playing bowls rather than just rolling a few bowls. The atmosphere was great, and everyone had a good time – well done.

Following productive discussions with the Brisbane City Council on securing a ten-year lease, as opposed to the standard three-year lease, the Board is currently preparing a Ten-Year Development Plan. This will be a four-stage process and includes a full kitchen refurbishment, the addition of a viewing deck for the bottom green, refurbishment of the bar lounge and refurbishment of the Carson Room. We are hoping we can obtain grants for at least some of the works while we are still working on obtaining a Grant to refurbish the bottom green.

The Annual General Meeting may still be four months away but now is the time to start thinking about doing something for your Club and taking on a position on one of the Bowls Committees or the Board. Most people have skills that can assist in the running of the Club so consider what you can do for your Club because without Committees the Club can't exist. The members doing the job now can't go on forever.

BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

Sponsors

I thank all sponsors for their ongoing support this year. The program is running very smoothly as we progress without lock downs.

Both the paper based Bowls Calendar and the Website Calendar are maintained up to date as any changes occur.

The huge rain event experienced in late February did not leave us unscathed. We suffered two separate incidents as a result:

1. Water entered the building from the Logan Road end having banked up against the front of the building and entering at ground level. All areas up to the front of the stage were effected. Whilst much of the area is tiled and easily cleaned, the carpet around the sides of the stage and in the ladies lounge areas were not so simple. We eventually were able to dry the stage area and with a professional clean the problem was remedied. Not so with the ladies lounge; which had an older wool carpet and underlay, which would not dry. Recarpeting the area was necessary.

My thanks to Brisbane City Council Community Facility Disaster Relief Program for their grant of funds which covered the replacement of the carpet and some plumbing which was necessary to ensure the problem does not reoccur.

2. We experienced a subsidence issue with rink 2 being on the top green. An area of the base approximately 75 cm x 20 cm fell away on the Club house end of the green. We sought the opinion of Berry Bowling Systems who have since attended and remedied the problem. My thanks to the Queensland Government Sport and Recreation Disaster Recovery Program and Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority who each provided grant funds to repair the green.

Other non weather related property matters include;

- replace the soffit to the full side of the Clubhouse
- repainting of the front, side and rear of the Clubhouse which has greatly improved its appearance.
- completion of the security fence at the western side of the covered green, replacing the chain wire fence previously in place.
- Replacement of the retaining wall, at the western side of the covered green.

Grants

There are currently three grants lodged awaiting decision.

1. The first is a Queensland Government Sport and Recreation Grant titled Active Clubs Round 2 in an amount of \$2,000. Funds are to be utilised in support of volunteer's efforts in the Club. We are targeting the cost of the marketing in support of the Try us Out Days by way of website advertising, videos and ongoing costs. Grant closed 23rd March, decision not to hand as yet.
2. A grant application to the Gambling Community Benefit Fund for funds to carry out a renovation and upgrade of our Club kitchen. Grant lodged 28th March, decision should be to hand late June.
3. An application to Queensland Government Community Sustainability Action Grant Round 6. We applied for funds for two items:
 1. Replace two chest freezers currently in use in the Club. Both are old and are inefficient in their energy usage.
 2. Air condition the switch room in which the solar inverters are located. The room currently becomes very hot which renders the inverters less efficient. Installing the unit and a related control unit which will ensure the temperature remains constant will ensure more efficient running of the solar system. Both matters were raised in an energy audit performed under the Resilient Club Support Program.

Lodged 28th April, no decision date indicated.

Retirement & Lifestyle Village Bowls Days

A decision has been made to extend the regularity of these days to bimonthly in a move hoped to attract more participants. Mainly COVID had caused the numbers to drop considerably so hoping the next day to be run in June will be well attended.

Friday Night Raffles

Friday night raffles continue to operate very well and I thank all volunteers involved. We offer four (4) meat trays and two (2) gift vouchers each week.

Newsletter

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, they will now issue on a quarterly basis with the next being September.

AN UPDATE ON THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

At the time of writing this article the final result of the Federal Election was unclear except to say there has been a change of Government. Whether that is a Labor majority Government or a Labor minority Government with the help of Greens and Independents are the 2 likely outcomes. But as you are reading this further down the track you will know the result of the election.

The purpose of this article is to inform you of the things that had bipartisan support whoever won the election and things that may be on the cards depending on who won the election.

What is in

Deeming rates have been frozen till at least 1 July 2024. This is really important to those receiving Centrelink benefits who may be assessed under the incomes test. Interest rates are on the rise, a good thing for pensioners who have not seen a rise for a decade but not so good for those with mortgages. This means that you can earn more interest and not be deemed higher for the income test.

Commonwealth Seniors Health Care Card eligibility thresholds will rise from 1 July 2022. This will mean more self-funded retirees will be eligible for the CSHCC. New thresholds will be

- \$90,000 a year for singles
- \$144,000 a year for couples
- \$180,000 a year for couples separated by illness, respite care or prison

Downsizer Rules changed in the last Federal Budget to reduce the eligibility age to 60 down from 65. This has now been further extended to 55 down from 60. There are criteria so you need to be over the rules as there is more than just age for eligibility.



Assets Test increases came into play in March, and these are already in play for Government under Centrelink regulations so the election result will not change this unless someone decides to tinker in the future.

At the time of the election being called, legislation was on the floor of Parliament to make concessions for pensioners who held grandfathered income stream products to be able to move to a more competitive product without losing grandfathering status. This legislation lapsed so we will have to see if the new Government sees fit to reintroduce this to Parliament.

No doubt the new Government will introduce other promises they made during the campaign, and I will inform you in following newsletters of things that you need to be aware of.
